Children will enjoy a number of fun activities designed to compare their play, socialization, motor skills, and overall developmental levels with other same-age children. Hearing and Vision screenings conducted by Portage County Health Dept. are included as part of the preschool screening. In addition, representatives and/or literature from various community services (Birth to Three, UMOS, Head Start, etc.) will be available to provide information regarding services offered to families with young children.

If you're concerned about the way your baby or toddler is developing, the "Birth to Three" program will also be screening children from 3 months of age through 2 ½ years. For a 45-minute screening appointment, contact Yengyee Lor-yang at Birth to Three Services at (715) 345-5984.

Note: The school district must locate, identify and evaluate ALL resident children with disabilities (including children with disabilities who attend private schools, regardless of the severity of the disability). The school district uses a special education screening program to locate and screen all children with suspected disabilities who are residents of the district and who have not graduated high school to determine whether a special education referral is appropriate. 

4K Registration – Coming Soon!

Four-year old kindergarten (4K) registration for the 2012-13 school year will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 21st at the Bancroft school from 8:45 am until 3:00 pm. To register for 4K, children must be 4 years of age on or before Sept. 1, 2012.

Registration must be completed on-site and will take about 20 minutes. No appointment is necessary. Your child's **original** birth certificate (no copies); name and phone numbers of your family doctor and dentist; and two emergency contact phone numbers will be required to register. Children who plan to attend 4K in the fall must also schedule an appointment to be screened on this day if they have not been screened in the past. Protective Behaviors Instruction

Our elementary guidance program called G.I.F.T.S. is focusing on three concepts this school year: **kindness, assertiveness and cooperation**. Within the "assertiveness" unit beginning in January, the elementary school counselor will be covering protective behavior skills with all students in grades K-5. The purpose is to teach personal safety and let children know that they can say "no" to unwanted touch, and to report such incidents to a trusted adult. There will be videos utilized as well as age appropriate discussion and/or books that will focus on the concept of "privacy." We will review the NO-GO-TELL rule. When in a situation in which someone's touch is unwanted: 1. Say **NO!** 2. **GO** away from the person if you can. 3. **Tell** a trusted adult right away!

Each child will be asked to develop a network of trusted adults they feel comfortable talking to when they have a problem. You are encouraged to review any materials on safety, privacy and networking that will come home with your child this month. "Once I told my mother and she didn't do anything. She didn't even say anything to him." (age 15)


"I didn't think my mom would believe me and I thought she'd get mad at me." (age 11)

Non-Fiction Murals

The first graders worked hard learning about different features of non-fiction books, such as photos, captions, and labels, just to name a few. To help them practice and gain more of an understanding about these features, they worked together to make two murals.

Our first mural was of an ocean habitat. The students picked a subject they were interested in researching and then started out by finding pictures in books or on the computer. Then they made their animal or plant, either individually or as a group, and put some labels on them. Next they did some research on their topic to write a brief caption telling us some real information. To add a little extra, they wrote a note about how to protect our oceans and labeled the three levels that are found in the ocean. Do you know what those levels are??

The second mural was focused on the desert habitat, which lent itself to a great lesson about contrast and similarities. Each student chose what they wanted to become a “specialist” about and did research to write a caption and to make an illustration (another feature) that went along with their topic. We had some great information about deserts in general, along with some about the plants and animals found there.

A great job was done by all the students!!







2012 WISCONSIN ELECTION LAW CHANGES

Many new election law changes will take effect with the upcoming 2012 elections and voters are reminded to go prepared for these changes as they head to the polls this spring.

PHOTO IDENTIFICATION

Beginning in 2012, you cannot receive a ballot until you have met ID requirements. Wisconsin does not issue a separate "Voter ID" card. Instead you must use one of the photo IDs listed below which you may already have in your possession. **Your photo ID does not need to show a current address.**

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PHOTO ID

Wisconsin driver license*

Wisconsin DOT-issued photo ID card*

U.S. passport*

Military ID card*

**The above documents may not have expired earlier than the date of the last November election.*

Certificate of naturalization issued within last two years

Unexpired Wisconsin driver license or state ID receipt

ID card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin.

Unexpired ID issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college that contains an issuance date, student signature, and expiration date within two years of issuance, along with a separate document showing proof of current enrollment.

If you are eligible to vote but do not have an acceptable ID, you may obtain a **free** ID for purposes of voting. Please visit <http://gab.wi.gov> and click "Voter Photo ID" for more information. You may also visit this website for photo id exemptions/exceptions.

SIGNING THE POLL BOOK

Voters must sign the poll book to obtain a ballot. The poll book now contains a signature block for each voter. Voters unable to sign the poll book because of a physical disability are exempt from this requirement. If this applies to you, tell the election officials that you are unable to sign because of a disability. Election officials will write "exempt" in your signature block.

VOTER REGISTRATION CHANGES

You can register to vote up until the Friday before the election or on Election Day. You must reside at your address for 28 consecutive days to be eligible to vote, and you may no longer use a corroborating witness as proof of residence. Proof of residence is required when registering less than 20 days before an election, on Election Day, and for first time Wisconsin voters registering by mail. For more information on acceptable proof of residence documents contact your local municipal clerk.
