

### 2024-2025 Immunization Information

As the weather gets warmer, we start to think about summer vacation. Summer vacation is a great time to get caught up on immunizations your student may need.

Per DHS guidelines, all students entering Kindergarten through 5th grade should have received 4 Polio, 3 Hepatitis B, 2 Varicella, 4 DTap, and 2 MMR vaccines. All students entering 7th grade should have received the Tdap vaccine.

If you wish to waive any vaccines, please fill out the immunization waiver form. The waiver form must be signed by a parent/guardian and each immunization you wish to waiver must be listed. Please list the reason you wish to waive the immunization by checking the correct box on the form.

### STUDENT IMMUNIZATION LAW AGE/GRADE REQUIREMENTS

The following are the minimum required immunizations for each age and grade level according to the Wisconsin Student Immunization Law. These requirements can be waived for health, religious, or personal conviction reasons. Additional immunizations may be recommended for your child depending on his or her age. Please contact your doctor or local health department to determine if your child needs additional immunizations.

- Children 5 years of age or older who are enrolled in a Pre-K class should be assessed using the immunization requirements for Kindergarten through Grade 6, which would normally correspond to the individual's age.
- D = diphtheria, T = tetanus, P = pertussis vaccine. DTaP/DTP/DT/Td vaccine for all students Pre-K through 12: Four doses are required. However, if a student received the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday, further doses are not required. Note: A dose four days or less before the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday is also acceptable.
- DTaP/DTP/DT vaccine for children entering Kindergarten: Each student must have received one dose after the 4th birthday (either the 3th, 4th, or 5th dose) to be compliant. Note: a dose four days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable.
- Tdap is an adolescent tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis combination vaccine. If a student received a dose of a tetanuscontaining vaccine, such as Td, within five years before entering the grade in which Tdap is required, the student is compliant and a dose of Tdap vaccine is not required.
- Polio vaccine for students entering grades Kindergarten through 12. Four doses are required. However, if a student received the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday, further doses are not required. Note: a dose four days or less before the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday is also acceptable.
- Laboratory evidence of immunity to hepatitis B is also acceptable.
- MMR is measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine. The first dose of MMR vaccine must have been received on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday. Laboratory evidence of immunity to all three diseases (measles and mumps and rubella) is also acceptable. Note: A dose four days or less before the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday is also acceptable.
- Varicella vaccine is chickenpox vaccine. Students with a reliable history of varicella disease are not required to receive the Varicella vaccine. A parent or guardian may indicate that their student has had chickenpox on the Student Immunization Record form (F-04020L).

# Vaccines Recommended at Ages 11-12: What Parents Should Know



Vaccines aren't just for babies. Some of the vaccines that babies get can become less effective as kids get older. As kids grow up they may also come in contact with different diseases than when they were babies. There are vaccines that can help protect your pre-teen or teen from these illnesses.

### What vaccines does my child need?

- Tdap vaccine: This continues protection against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough).
- Quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate (MCV4) (meningococcal ACWY) vaccine: This vaccine protects
  against infection from Neisseria menigitidis in the lining of the brain, spinal cord, and bloodstream. Preteens should get the first dose when they are 11 or 12 and a booster at age 16.
- Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine: This vaccine prevents some pre-cancers and cancers related to HPV.
   Pre-teens should get two doses before they turn 13 years old.
- A yearly flu vaccine: It protects against getting sick and spreading the flu virus.
- COVID-19 vaccines: Staying up to date on COVID-19 boosters will help prevent getting sick from COVID-19.

### When should my child be vaccinated?

- During a yearly health checkup. Ask your doctor or nurse every year if there are any vaccines that your child may need.
- At a physical exam required for sports, school, or camp.

### What else should I know about these vaccines?

- These vaccines have all been studied carefully through clinical trials to evaluate safety and how well they
  work before they are used with the general public. Even after they are licensed for public use, scientists
  continue to monitor the safety of vaccines.
- Most side effects from vaccines such as pain at the injection site are mild and go away quickly on their own. Serious side effects from vaccines are rare.
- It is very important to tell the doctor or nurse if your child has any serious allergies, including allergies to yeast, latex, or chicken eggs, before they receive any vaccines.
- If you have questions, talk to your doctor or health care provider.

- The Vaccines for Children (VFC) program provides vaccines for children ages 18 years and younger, who






## When School's Out, **Summer EBT is Here to Help!**

Summer EBT (Electronic Benefit Transfer) is an income-based program that helps families buy food for their children while school is out. Wisconsin will send \$120 for each child who qualifies. You can use these benefits anywhere that FoodShare benefits are accepted, like most grocery stores, many convenience stores, and some farmer's markets.

### Your child should get benefits automatically if:

- Your child was approved to get free or reduced price meals at their National School Lunch
- You have given your child's school an alternate household income form that shows you meet the income requirements for Summer EBT.
- Your child is school-aged and your household is part of FoodShare, W-2, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, or an income-based Medicaid program; or if we know they are a migrant, in foster care, or experiencing homelessness.



Watch your mail towards the end of June! If your family qualifies, you'll get a letter about your child's benefits.



Getting Summer EBT will not affect your child's or family's immigration status.

### What if I think my child might qualify for benefits but my family does not participate in any of the programs listed on this flyer?

- If your child's school participates in the National School Lunch Program, you can apply for Free or Reduced Price Lunch (FRPL) through their school. If your child's application is approved, you will get Summer EBT.
- If you apply and are approved by August 29 for one of the state benefit programs mentioned on the front of this flyer, you will be able to get Summer EBT for your child. You can learn more about other state benefit programs by calling 211 or visiting access.wi.gov.

We will continue to send benefits to eligible families throughout the summer as we get their information. If you have recently moved, update your address at SummerEBT.wi.gov/s/ SummerBenefitInfo

#### How will my family get benefits?

If your child qualifies for Summer EBT and you already have a QUEST card or a P-EBT card from the pandemic, we will put your benefits on that card. If you don't, we'll mail you a new QUEST card.

## What if my family doesn't get Summer EBT in June and we think we should

If you do not get benefits in June, we might not have enough information to know if your child qualifies for Summer EBT. For us to get that information, you should complete a Summer EBT Application. You can access the Summer EBT application at SummerEBT.wi.gov/s/SummerEBTApp.

### Can our family still use other summer food benefits if we get Summer EBT?

Yes! If your child gets Summer EBT they can still participate in other programs like the Summer Food Service Program or the Seamless Summer Option.

Summer EBT (Electronic Benefit Transfer [transferencia electrónica de beneficios]) es un programa basado en los ingresos que sirve para ayudar a las familias a comprar alimentos para sus hijos mientras no hay clases. Wisconsin enviará \$120 por cada niño que califique. Puede utilizar estos beneficios en cualquier lugar donde se acepten los beneficios de FoodShare, como la mayoría de los supermercados, muchas tiendas de conveniencia y algunos mercados agrícolas.

### Su hijo debería recibir beneficios automáticamente si ocurre lo siguiente:

- · Su hijo está en edad escolar y su hogar forma parte de FoodShare, W-2, el Food Distribution Program (Programa de Distribución de Alimentos) en Reservas Indígenas o un income-based Medicaid program (programa de Medicaid basado en los ingresos); o si sabemos que es inmigrante, está en un hogar de acogida o no tiene hogar
